Code of Conduct

- 1. The way you are expected to behave at school is the behavior expected from you on this trip. All school rules apply during the trip.
- 2. Loud talking, shouting, improper language, pushing, shoving, and fighting will not be tolerated.
- 3. Comments are not to be directed to pedestrians or motorists. This is considered disrespectful and dangerous.
- 4. Students must also show respect to all other tourists staying at the group's hotel, and must at all times keep volume levels at a reasonable level both in their individual rooms and in the public areas including the hotel lobby and hallways.
- 5. Polite table manners are to be practiced at all times. Absolutely no throwing of food, paper products, or straws. You are not to disturb those sitting at your table or near you.
- 6. Electronic devices, with the exception of cell phones as detailed on the Cell Phone Use Agreement, will not be permitted on this trip. Cell phones will only be allowed during the day, with the exception of lengthy bus trips, and will be collected by chaperones at the end of each day and redistributed in the morning.
- 7. You are **not permitted** to leave the hotel or the tour site without the permission of your chaperone.
- 8. Mistreatment of another student, the motor coach, or the hotel will not be tolerated. Parents and students assume full responsibility for any damage done to any facility including the hotel property and busses.
- 9. Students must be with a chaperone at all times when the group is away from the hotel. **Always travel in a group of at least two**.
- 10. Students must follow the directions of the tour manager, staff, and chaperones at all times on this tour.
- 11. Students will not open the hotel room door for anyone other than your chaperone.
- 12. Students should not borrow money, clothing, food, or drink from another student.

13. No student shall have in his possession any drugs, alcohol, tobacco, or any other things deemed dangerous. If a student is found with any of these things or is caught shoplifting *he/she will be subject immediately to consequence number 4*.

It is expected that all students will conduct themselves as ladies and gentlemen throughout the trip. Courtesy and good manners should be practiced always. Any student who disregards this code of conduct or displays any other behavior that is inappropriate will be subject to the consequences below.

Consequences:

- 1. You will be given a verbal warning, which will be documented.
- 2. Removal from your group for the remainder of the time on site to the company of your chaperone.
- 3. Removal from your group to the company of your chaperone for the remainder of *the* day in addition to a call home.
- 4. If a student is shoplifting or has in his possession any drugs, alcohol, tobacco, or any other dangerous articles or is engaged in any dangerous behavior, he/she will be sent home immediately at the expense of their parents. (steps 1-3 do not apply for the behavior described in #4. Immediate expulsion from the trip will occur.) Possible suspension or expulsion from school may follow.
